Trigger / Conditions	Normal Conditions No emergency situation present.	Trigger 1 Conditions Minor mechanism of injury event (e.g. hit by a slow object etc.). Incident involving a single potential life threat, for example: - person injured with extremity (hand/forearm/foot/lower leg partially pinned); - person is uninjured but encapsulated, trapped at height or in confined space; or - cuts/lacerations/blunt trauma. Person is responsive and communicating.	Trigger 2 Conditions Moderate or unknown mechanism of injury event (e.g. single vehicle rollover, light vehicle – pedestrian interaction, crushed by equipment, missing person etc.). Incident involving an actual life threat to one or more people, for example: - person injured with extremity and partial body (upper arm/shoulder/thigh) crushed; or - person with known injuries is encapsulated, trapped at height or in confined space. Person has altered level of consciousness.	Trigger 3 Conditions Major life-threatening mechanism of injury event (e.g. multiple vehicle interaction, explosion, crushed between equipment and/or structure, fall from height etc.). Incident involving immediate compromise to life, for example: - person injured with body (abdomen/chest/head) crushed; or - person with unknown injuries is encapsulated, trapped at height or in confined space. Person is unresponsive or unconscious.
All Personnel	Undertake basic risk management. Maintain awareness of potential emergency situations. Understand emergency call process. Be aware of emergency equipment and emergency assembly locations.	Initiate emergency response by calling emergency over mine radio. If in a confined space or at height, do not attempt a rescue. Apply DRSABCD and attempt to control or stabilise the injury. Maintain contact with Incident Controller and guide Emergency Response Team to the incident scene.
